2020-2021 At A Glance

September 9-November 13: Rancocas/Delaware Hybrid with asynchronous learning (K-12). Full days, with Lunch. Remote Wednesdays.

November 16-January 15: Fully synchronous remote learning with live office hours K-12

January 19-March 19: Rancocas/Delaware Hybrid with concurrent learning (Grades 3-12) with live office hours. Rancocas/Delaware Hybrid with asynchronous and live office hours Grades K-2. Single Session. Remote Wednesdays.

March 11, 2021: Board approves expansion of in-person instruction by reintroducing full days, transitioning to five days of onsite instruction (April 12)

2020-2021 At A Glance

March 19, 2021: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention offers modification to student spacing recommendation given public health factors.

March 20, 2021: Community advisement of CDC recommendations while waiting for further recommendations from NJDOE.

March 22, 2021 -Present: Rancocas/Delaware Hybrid with concurrent learning (Grades 1-12). In person Kindergarten. Full day, with Lunch.

March 24, 2021: New Jersey Department of Health offers modification to student spacing recommendation given certain public health factors.

CDC Operational Strategies for K-12 Schools (3/19/21)

Revised physical distancing recommendations to reflect at least 3 feet between students in classrooms

Provides clearer guidance for when greater distances are required

Ventilation is a component of strategies to clean and maintain healthy facilities

Remove recommendation of physical barriers

Role of community transmission levels in decision making

CDC Operational Strategies for K-12 Schools (3/19/21)

Maintain all prior mitigation strategies (masking, hand washing, cleaning, ventilation, shared objects, etc.)

Physical distancing

Elementary School: Students three feet apart

Secondary School: Students three feet apart except in areas of high community transmission if cohorting is not possible where six feet of distancing should be used to the maximal extent practicable

Contact Tracing/Quarantine

New Jersey Department of Health Guidance (3/23/21)

Millbridge, DIS and DMS (cohorted): Recommend full in person with minimum of 3 feet of physical distancing with masks

<u>DHS</u>: In low/moderate level recommend full in person with minimum of 3 feet of physical distancing with masks. In high risk level consider in person instruction if able to maximize physical distancing of 6 feet or more to the maximal extent practicable with masks

New Jersey Department of Health Guidance (3/23/21)

Plexiglass removed from recommended practice

Close Contact definition unchanged

Quarantine Guidelines

Community Transmission Defined: CDC v NJDOH

CDC: "Substantial Transmission"

At least three feet at the elementary level. At least six feet at the middle and high school level (with masks and mitigation) unless they can cohort (DMS can while DHS cannot).

NJDOH: "High Risk"

At least three feet of physical distance between students at the elementary level and DMS (with masks and mitigation). At the high school level consider in person instruction if able to maximize physical distancing of 6 feet or more to the maximal extent practicable

Recommendation

Millbridge, DIS & DMS: Change Language in Restart and Recovery Plan to reflect the following

Merge Cohorts

3 feet of distancing

Full day, with lunch, five days per week

Continue remote option

Continued mitigation strategies

Increase tents for lunches

Recommendation

DHS: Change Language in *Restart and Recovery Plan* to reflect the following

Merge Cohorts

Full day, with lunch, five days per week

3 feet of distancing

Continue remote option

Continued mitigation strategies

Increase tents for lunches

Implementation: April 19, 2021 or To Be Determined dependent on public health factors at the discretion of the Superintendent of Schools in consultation with the Board of Education and Department of Health

Regardless of implementation date all seniors invited to attend daily full day on site instruction on April 19 for reminder of school year

Proposed School Schedules: Millbridge, DIS and DMS

Week of April 12: Begin 5 days per week of full day onsite instruction in Rancocas/Delaware Cohort model

April 14: Rancocas Day

Week of April 19: Begin 5 days per week of full day onsite instruction for all students by merging Rancocas/Delaware Cohorts into one

Proposed School Schedules: DHS

Week of April 12: Begin 5 days per week of onsite instruction in Rancocas/Delaware Cohort model

April 14: Rancocas Onsite Day

Week of April 19 or To Be Determined: Begin 5 days per week of onsite instruction for all students by merging Rancocas/Delaware Cohorts into one depending on public health factors and NJDOH consultation

If planned April 19 merging of cohorts is delayed due to public health matters, all Seniors will be invited to attend school five days per week starting April 19 until full reopening can be executed

Recommendation Rationale

Belief in our practices

Full day schedule allows for fallback plan of Single Sessions if public health worsens

Adheres to CDC/NJDOH guidance

Provides in person instruction

Social emotional student benefit

Understanding employee health

Allows to test run for September - Guidance not likely to change significantly
